Dear Friends, Partners & Beloved sponsors,

November & December was the period of both joy and depressing moments in Tamil Nadu. It started off with the Diwali - the festival of lights on November 6th, it is all about worshipping the deities, burning crackers, having sweets and making merry with the loved ones. A week ahead, on November 16th Tamil Nadu & Puducherry (karaikal Region) was wrecked havoc by the cyclone GAJA. This cyclonic storm crossed Tamil Nadu & Puducherry coast between Nagapattinam & Vedaranniyam in the early hours between 00.30 to 2.30 am with a wind speed of 110 – 120 kmph and also brought heavy rain in the coastal districts. The strong wind damaged several thatched houses, electric poles and uprooted many trees. Holidays was announced for schools and colleges. Early steps were taken by the State governments and about 80,000 people were evacuated to 470 relief camps in Tamil Nadu. Gaja has entirely devastated the livelihoods of farmers in the four coastal districts. About 30000 hectares of Coconut trees and cash crops were damaged, mostly uprooted. Totally 56,000 hectares of crops and trees were destroyed due to the cyclone.

On humanitarian basis many organizations and individuals have taken initiative in supporting the cyclone victims by providing them Relief and Rehabilitation services in turn of securing the life of the people. However the relief announced by the State for loss of livestock and crops is grossly insufficient.

Then the schools were resumed after holidays and the syllabus for the half – yearly exams were screwed up as the exams dates were nearing. The exams were scheduled from 10th to 22nd December and now the children are on festive break to celebrate Christmas and New Year 2019. Pondicherry encounters a pleasant sunshine in the daylight hours and a relatively low temperature around 20°C in the latter part of the day.

Here's to a bright **New Year** and a fond farewell to the old; here's to the things that are yet to come, and to the memories that we hold.” “May everyone have a prosperous **New Year**.” “Wishing each and everyone a happy, healthy **New Year**.” “May the **new year** bless you with health, wealth and happiness.”

All 85 children were given a complete screening test and the ophthalmologists gave advices to the children on protection of eye and aliments that are to be consumed for better vision. After the examination, 3 students were opted for spectacles and 4 students were referred for further investigation.

The hand woven fabrics and made-ups from Atelier Shanthi were exhibited. The products such as soaps, spirulina and cleansing agents (phenol, soap oil, washing powder), bracelets, chains, paintings were also available for sale. 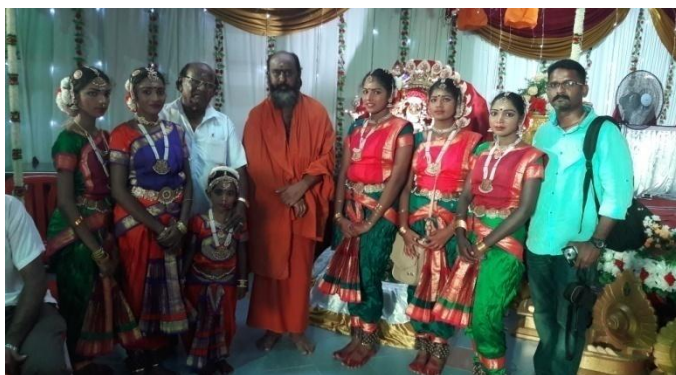

A large pot made out of clay was placed to cook Pongal in the traditional manner with fire wood.
